
WHAT DO THESE STATISTICS SAY TO US?

The stats reflect that Nazarene ministers throughout Africa have LIMITED ACCESS to education and training to qualify for ordination.

The North American Church is blessed with multiple ways to train pastors such that it has a large, ordained clergy pool to oversee the work of the church. However, the African Church faces steep challenges to provide training for leaders to oversee the explosion of growth.

WHAT ARE AFRICAN LEADERS DOING ABOUT THE EDUCATIONAL GAP?

African leaders are developing two new degree-level institutions – one for French-speaking leaders, and the other for Portuguese-speaking leaders. They are translating handbooks and gathering digital library resources in both languages. 
WHAT CAN EACH OF US DO ABOUT THIS GAP?

GRADUATES FROM ALL SEVEN NAZARENE DISTRICTS IN ZIMBABWE

I have many stories that I can write about this graduation. I like the stories especially from the students because I know that those stories are what are very important in their desire to serve God and reach out to the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

God has been faithful over the years in this training program, but especially when the world was hit by the Covid pandemic and everything was affected, with churches in-person services closed; businesses went low and for some time no one knew what would happen. Everyone was doing everything to keep themselves alive and to survive. Our training program was not spared from the effects of all the lock downs and shutdowns and social distancing. We train men and women who have work so that they can feed their families and take care of many things in their lives. Every time a student would tell us that they now have a phone, a tablet or laptop to which we can transfer notes in softcopy, the lectures could focus on discussions more than dictating notes. So when Covid happened, it almost was a confirmation of the need to have all students have a smart phone and to learn online applications. I should also mention that a few months prior to Covid hitting the world, we had conducted a seminar on "ONLINE" services and classes. All this was as if we knew Covid was coming.

Anyhow, rushing to the end of the story... we had to do everything online for the rest of the course up until restrictions were lifted. But through it all we learnt a lot of what needs to be done. This is where we are now, we managed to have students finish their course outlines, learn, and graduate. This graduation was a true testimony that "through it all we learn to trust in Jesus".

Well, this is just a piece of the story but that's what makes life worth living and our God worth of all honor and glory in Christ Jesus.

We have given ourselves fully to this mission which is to equip men and women who are ready to make disciples in all nations.
