
## AUGUST FOR AFRICA 2023 Churches that have Already Given EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT UNITED FELLOWSHIP

## A Reminder about Why We Give

Why August for "Africa"? Why not "August for Australia" or "August for Asia" or "August for Austria"? Well, currently, 1 in 4 Christians in the world live in Africa! The Church of the Nazarene in Africa enjoys an exploding growth of believers and, at the same time, grapples with a huge challenge to train up pastors and lay leaders. African Nazarenes that speak English have options for education that do not exist in other languages. Major languages in Africa include French and Portuguese.

\*\*Currently Africa has approximately 8,500 Churches of the Nazarene and about 1,800 ordained clergy, making **4.7 churches for every ordained elder**. That's too many! In the training pipeline are another 2,500 (1,500 district licensed clergy and 1,000 locally licensed ministers). If and when these 2,500 are ordained, there will 4,300 elders, so **1.98 churches per elder**. But by then there will surely be more churches to pastor, so the race is on to train many, many more!
